Feeling helpless

When S and D first reached out to us, they were at breaking point. Their young son E had been struggling at home, socially, and at school for a long time. He was full of energy, curious, and incredibly bright – but also found some everyday tasks incredibly tough. S and D have known that their son sees and experiences the world a little differently to other children his age. He was easily overwhelmed, has big emotional outbursts, and was beginning to fall further behind at school. S and D suspected their son might have autism and ADHD, but with long waitlists, expensive specialists, and the rising cost of living, getting a formal diagnosis felt completely out of reach. S and D described knowing their son needed support but being unable to provide it. "Its heartbreaking watching your child struggle and not being able to get them the help they need", S told me.

On top of that, the family were facing financial hardship, and found paying rent, putting food on the table, and covering regular medications, nearly impossible. Despite their attempts to implement a strict budget, their financial situation has been worsening each week, and S and D had skipped meals to ensure that their son was fed, and that they had a roof over their head.

Since first visiting St John's Care for support, we have been walking alongside S, D, and their son E for several months now – helping them navigate the complex systems around mental health diagnosis and support services. We have helped them find specialist medical appointments and provided some financial assistance towards these costs. Each week, S and D have visited SJC and have been provided with essential food and pantry items, as well as assistance with E's prescriptions. Additionally, we have advocated for the family with other support services, making referrals and helping the family access additional support through E's school.

They note that having someone there to listen to them, understand their situation, and respond with the appropriate support has changed their life. This journey isn't over for S, D and their son E and there are still many challenges ahead. It has been a slow journey but thanks to the kindness of our donors and supporters, they're no longer walking that challenging road alone.
