

Transition into a New Life

This morning, I had a message from one of my clients telling me she has a friend named P who needs SJC's help. She asked whether she could bring her friend to meet with me and have a chat to which I wholeheartedly agreed.

When they arrived, I invited them to a private place to talk. I explained to P that everything we discussed would remain confidential unless she wanted me to share this information with other entities (whereby a consent form is then signed by the client).

P explained she had been in a very toxic and violent relationship with her baby daughter's father. As she described the abuse she had endured she was crying, making it almost impossible for her to talk.

P told me she has no one here in Australia and this has been very difficult for her. Her partner was very controlling, preventing her from working, going out or having any kind of social interaction with others while subjecting her to years of daily insults and abuse.

One day while buying milk for her baby, she met L (a client of SJC) and they immediately connected as they speak the same language. P was so happy to have a conversation with someone. She cried as she told L about her life. L recommended she visit St John's Care, where she herself had received great support.

A fortnight ago, P's ex-partner left home

after they had a big fight and has not returned. P has been left with sole responsibility for all household bills as well as baby supplies.

I made referrals for DVCS & ONE-LINK so P could apply for affordable long-term accommodation. I told her about CENTRELINK for income support assistance and agreed she could visit SJC weekly for help with food and baby needs.

Due to her visa status, P was also referred to the MULTICULTURAL HUB, MARSS, COMPANION HOUSE and ROUNDABOUT for other essential support for her baby and herself.

The support we were able to give her brought P huge relief. She is very grateful to SJC for both listening to and helping her. St John's Care continues to support P, her baby and other Canberrans in need. Thank you to everyone who donates to our organisation or supports us in the many ways you do.
