



#### **MISSION MATTERS**


On Wednesday 30 October, the Robertson room was full of people who attended the Bush Church Aid information evening. BCA supports ministry in Anglican parishes which are unable to fully fund themselves.

We met Ben and Alissa Connelly from Cowra, who had son Josiah, daughter Vivienne and baby Ezekiel with them. Their congregation is small, but Ben is finding that he is conducting a lot of funerals. They and the leaders of the other 5 churches in Cowra have begun to plan the combined churches Carol Service set for December 20. Let's pray that this event will be a happy occasion, well attended and will build God's Kingdom in Cowra.

We also met Neville Naden, the Indigenous Ministry Officer who is based in Dubbo, but travels the country supporting and encouraging indigenous ministry.

A lasting connection

This is the story of *H*, a man in his 50s whose journey we had the privilege of being a part of until his passing. H lived with a significant physical disability that limited him, he relied on a mechanical aid and was often confined to his home. For many years, he shared his life with his partner, but her passing left him living alone. Once successful in his career, his deteriorating health forced him to stop working. After losing his long-time partner, he faced increasing isolation.

I first met H when he called St. John's Care for food assistance. During that initial conversation, we spoke at length about his needs and how SJC could support him, he expressed how much it meant to have someone genuinely listen to him. From then on, while I supported him with practical needs, it was often our conversations that brought him the most comfort.

Two weeks ago, H fell at home and was rushed to the hospital with broken ribs. While recovering, he suddenly experienced sharp chest pains and was moved to the ICU. After a few days, he reached out and asked if I could visit. Seeing him in such a fragile state was heartbreaking, but H managed a smile and said, "It's so good to see a familiar face." He asked me to visit again, and I promised I would.

H shared his uncertainties about his health and recovery but told me how much comfort

he found in our visits. He asked if I could return in a couple of days, and I gladly promised to do so.

Sadly, two days later, H's brother called to share the news that H had passed away. Although they weren't close, his brother told me H often spoke about the positive impact St. John's Care had on his life.

While losing H was devastating, I'm grateful for the opportunity to have spent time with him in his final days. His story is a poignant reminder that the support we provide extends far beyond food or clothing. At St. John's Care, we offer connection, compassion, and a sense of safety—often filling a void that many in our community feel deeply.

H's resilience and gratitude will stay with me, and his memory will continue to inspire the work we do every day.


