Is Christmas still relevant?

As our world concludes yet another troubled year, Christmas takes us back to an age with its own injustices and uncertainties. Can that original Christmas event so many years ago still speak to modern times?

Not if it's just a fairy tale or a crude collection of myths.

Yet the gospel writers seem clear that it is far more than that. They speak of a series of real events, whose fantastic and miraculous elements are not pious inventions, but evidence of a moment of infinite power and unique importance.

The gospel accounts are bristling with joyful amazement as the news is announced to Mary, Joseph, shepherds and sages that something new has broken into the world's routine – something of barely imaginable grandeur. The subsequent dramatic life and impact of the baby who was born that night testify to the credibility of these accounts.

This baby is 'Emmanuel' - God with

us. And with us in the most profound sense possible. For in this child, God fused his life forever to ours, bridging the gap between humanity and divinity and showing his determination to redeem and save.

The word's instabilities and troubles have persisted over the past 2000 years. Yet what God has done in seeking us out and drawing near to us continues to have obvious relevance, making our various problems pale by comparison.

That is why the relevance of this story can never fade. And it is why every year, in communities like ours all around the world, people are finding new hope, help and meaning for their lives in the one who was born on that first Christmas.

On behalf of the St John's ministry team, I wish you a very merry Christmas. May the joy and wonder of this season grow as you come more fully to know Jesus Christ and his great love for the world.

I look forward to exploring this together in 2025.

5 January 2025: The Epiphany of our Lord

(Readings: Isaiah 60.1-6; Psalm 72.1-7, 10-14; Ephesians 3.1-12; Matthew 2.1-12)

12 January 2025: The Baptism of Our Lord

(Readings: Isaiah 43.1-7; Psalm 29; Acts 8.14-17; Luke 3.15-22)

19 January 2025: Second Sunday after Epiphany

(Readings: Isaiah 62.1-5; Psalm 36.5-10; 1 Corinthians 12.1-11; John 2.1-11)

26 January 2025: Third Sunday after Epiphany

(Readings: Nehemiah 8.1-3, 5-6,8-10; Psalm 19; 1 Corinthians 12.12-31; Luke 4.14-21)
